

Yellowfield: Expanded History

Introduction

Yellowfield is not merely a location — it is a convergence zone, a ritual field soaked in recurring myth, peripheral study, and suppressed phenomena. Its placement between the known geographies of the Basilica and Cathedral sites suggests it was never meant to be seen directly, only remembered.

Timeline Overview

- 1973 – First official documentation in Field Observation Log CF-22 by the Institute for Peripheral Phenomena. Mild anomalies noted.
- 1981 – Surveillance footage logged of 'Stone X' shimmer. No follow-up authorized.
- 1991 – Personal notes from researcher M. LeClaire reference auditory distortions and sigil marks.
- 2025 – Ritual confirmed and completed by Jared (Walter Red), observed by a secondary Keeper presence.

Field Markers and Anomalies

Field sketches recovered from the site reveal a unique pattern of circular tramlings and sigil etchings in both flora and soil. Boot prints vanish mid-step. Certain flower clusters align to a glyph system — now partially decoded.

The Minor Glyph Key

This partially decoded system associates specific bloom formations to ritual concepts:

- Bloom 3 – Memory
- Bloom 5 – Witness
- Bloom 13 – Return
- Bloom 21 – [REDACTED]

Declassified Archivist Commentary

Recovered memo suggests Yellowfield began self-manifesting sigils before formal engagement. Cathedral ledger withheld. Final note: 'If it speaks again, I will listen. But I won't answer twice.'

External Observations & Narthax Interference

One fragment from an intercepted Narthax report implies Yellowfield's anomaly was catalogued but excluded from official Basilica logs. Terms like 'Echo Manifest' and 'non-linear recurrence node' were used sparingly. Photograph timestamped April 17, 1981, shows unexplained shimmer event.

Final Notes

Yellowfield remains spiritually active, though contained. It functions as a place of ritual teaching and personal reckoning. The original hive may still be traceable. No further entries are expected unless reactivation occurs.
